




California Native Plants that help conserve water



Chalk Dudleya

When planted properly, this beautiful succulent thrives on full sun exposure while also being surrounded by rocks. It flowers in the spring and summer seasons and requires little water. The maintenance is also low and easy. The Chalk Dudleya grows at a moderate pace and can grow up to a foot tall.

California Fuchsia

California Fuchsia is a perennial that is native to the foothills. Another name for the California Fuchsia is the Hummingbird Flower. This plant is very easy to grow, requires full sun, little water and has a fast growth rate.





White Sage

White Sage is commonly known as shrub. It can grow quite rapidly and up to 4 feet tall and up to 8 feet wide. White sage requires full sun, extremely low moisture, and is easy to take care of. White sage is widely used amongst Native Americans who use the leaves as an incense for ceremonial purposes.

California Poppy

The California Poppy is a fast growing, drought tolerant, annual plant that is self seeding and easy to grow. it does best in full sun and can grow up to 2 feet tall.





Silver Lupine

This beautiful plant falls under the shrub category. It can grow quite fast and up to 5 feet tall and 3 feet wide. Silver Lupine requires full sun, low moisture, and is very easy to take care of.

Common Yarrow

Common Yarrow is known to be used as ground cover. It requires minimal care, full sun, and low moisture.
